We source our Natural Stone from quarries and premium suppliers all over the world. As a natural product, each type of stone has varying characteristics that need to be considered as part of a maintenance regime for the stone. We recommend following this general maintenance guide.

1. General Cleaning Procedures

Daily Cleaning

- Use pH-neutral cleaners: Avoid harsh or acidic cleaners that can etch or dull the surface.
- Soft tools only: Use a soft microfiber cloth, sponge, or mop for cleaning. Avoid abrasive scrubbers.
- Warm water: A solution of warm water and a mild, pH-neutral dish soap is ideal for routine cleaning.
- Dry thoroughly: After cleaning, wipe the surface dry to prevent water spots and streaks.

Spill Management

- Clean immediately: Promptly wipe up spills to prevent staining, especially from acidic substances like lemon juice, vinegar, wine, or coffee.
- Blot, don't wipe: For spills, blot gently to avoid spreading.

2. Maintenance Tips

Sealing

• Apply sealant: Natural stone is porous and benefits from periodic sealing to enhance stain resistance. For recommendations regarding sealing please email info@honesurfaces.com.au.

Avoiding Damage

- Use trivets and coasters: Protect the stone from extreme heat and scratches by using trivets under hot pots and pans and coasters under drinks.
- Avoid heavy impacts: Prevent chips and cracks by handling heavy items with care near the stone.
- Use cutting boards: Always use a cutting board when preparing food to avoid scratching the surface.

3. Stain Removal

4. Special Considerations for Each Stone Type

Marble and Limestone

• These stones are more sensitive to acids. Avoid acidic cleaners and be extra cautious with acidic foods and beverages.

Granite

• Granite is highly durable but still benefits from regular sealing to prevent staining.

Quartzite and Dolomite

• These stones are harder and more scratch-resistant but still require sealing for optimal protection.

Travertine

• Use a stone-specific filler for any natural pits or holes to prevent dirt accumulation. Avoid abrasive cleaning tools.

5. Long-Term Care

Professional Maintenance

• Professional cleaning and sealing services can ensure the best results.

Routine Inspection

• Periodically inspect your stone for chips, cracks, or dullness. Address issues early to prevent further damage.
